Date of the ultrasound is Nov. 2, 2025, at 10 Critter Court, Springfield, OH.

The requirements for usage of the grant are as follows: All dogs must be five or over and never diagnosed with bladder cancer.



Barn Hunt Open - two minutes and 30 seconds to find two tubes with rats (leave the two tubes of litter and empty tube alone) climb and tunnel with 90-degree turn.
