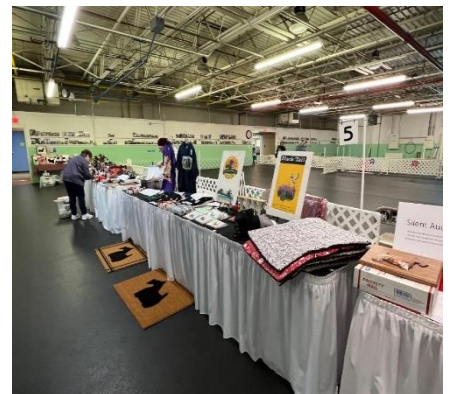
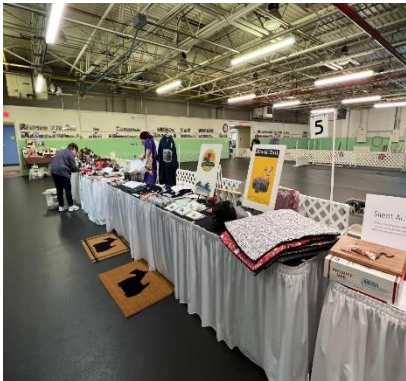

The scotties have been busy since we last spoke.

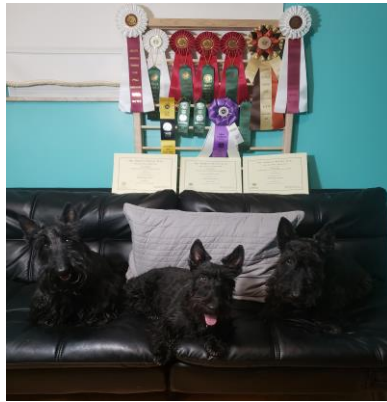
